## Coronavirus Update

As you are all aware the COVID situation across the country continues to change rapidly so we wanted to update everyone with the current policies in place regarding COVID and Brambles childcare. (Please be aware this can change in line with government guideline updates)

Firstly, please continue to keep your child at home if they are showing any signs/symptoms of COVID-19 and request a PCR test.

Secondly, please do not send your child to Brambles if they have tested positive on a lateral Flow test. New rules now state that people who have a positive lateral flow test without COVID symptoms, no longer need to have a PCR test to confirm they have COVID. Instead, they automatically start isolating for 7 days from their positive result and they should report their positive result to the government website to allow track and trace to follow up contacts. If your child receives a negative lateral flow test on day 6 and day 7 (24 hours apart), then they may return to attending brambles childcare.

Thirdly, in order to protect others in Brambles, please do not send your child/children into Brambles if a member of their household tests positive for COVID. Your child may return after the family member finishes isolating along with a negative lateral flow test result on your child/children. In this situation where your child did not have COVID but was not allowed to attend brambles, a credit note would be provided for any sessions that had already been paid for but not received.

We also wanted to inform you of our contingency plans if COVID affects our workforce. Our priority would be to stay operating as normal however, if staff sickness levels meant we are unable to provide safe staffing levels then limits would have to be placed on numbers of children attending. In which case priority would be given to children of key workers, vulnerable and SEND children. The children we could not accommodate would be asked not to attend until staffing levels were back to safe levels. Those that were asked not to attend would be provided with a credit note for any sessions that had already been paid for but not received.

# Teddy Bear Room Update

We welcomed lots of new children into the Teddy Bear Room in September so we spent the first few weeks settling them into the room, getting to know them and their families. An 'All about me' board was displayed with photos, handprints and information about each child, the children enjoyed the photographs that were sent in from home, it sparked a lot of conversations and reassures the less confident children at times to show them familiar pictures.

A big topic we covered was 'Autumn.' Some activities included:

- ☺ Small parts & Playdoh
- ☺ Creating our own pumpkins with Pens/Collaging
- ☺ Mark marking with Autumnal objects
- ☺ Autumn tactile tray which included Conkers, Pinecones, leaves and a pumpkin.
- ☺ Autumnal scavenger hunt to Bluntisham fields/park

In October the children started Forest School, the children who join us in the forest have loved these sessions and gained a lot from this experience. Staff are often asked 'Are we going to the forest today?' throughout the week. At Forest school we have:

- ☺ Hunted for bugs
- ☺ Built dens and "campfires" with leaves and sticks
- ☺ Used mud and water to make yummy 'food' in the mud kitchen

The children in our room currently have had to grow up during the peak of COVID and we know a lot of them have missed out important social opportunities like, baby/toddler groups and visiting family. As a result of this being part of a group is a big learning curve which we are supporting on a daily basis. Social development skills we are prompting are turn taking, sharing and confidence in playing alongside others in group. We have gradually introduced short group times such as register or an interactive story sack (our current favourite is the Hungry Caterpillar) and all children are at a point where they will participate which is fantastic!!!

Interests recently are vehicles. we have spent lots of time building train tracks, racing the small cars, diggers in the sand and exploring our vehicle talking boxes to promote language.

Dear Zoo has been a popular book, we made a story basket with all the animals to use as props alongside the book. The farm is a set of toys which is requested weekly, we are learning about where animals live and the names of the baby animals!!

All the staff and children really enjoyed our end of term Christmas party!!

# Pre-School Room Update

Autumn is the start of the new academic year, and this brings changes for everyone. There is a period of adjustment as children settle back into structured routines and get used to spending time away from parents after a long summer break at home.

As the children are now pre-schoolers, they will have moved rooms and be working with different members of staff. Importantly, staff and children need time to get to know each other and build relationships. For this reason there will be a good range and variety of toys and activities available, to help staff better understand each of the children's interests, personalities and abilities.

The main difference children will notice is that more time is spent as a group doing 'carpet time' activities than before. For example, the children will be used to sitting down as a group and listening to a story, but now they may be asked questions afterwards.

There will be adult-led activities, discussion and learning opportunities covering the specific areas of maths, literacy, understanding the world and expressive art and design. For example, this term we've learnt about our teeth and going to the Dentist. Carpet time promotes confidence and team building as well as improving concentration, listening and reasoning skills; all of which are designed to help them prepare for Reception. Topics will also be covered through books, craft, songs, games, role-play, movement or tasks.

Things we have done this term:

**All about me** – Things I know about myself. In what ways are people the same or different to others?

**Feelings** – Can I identify my different moods and feelings? What makes me happy? Do I understand the feelings of others?

**Brambles' rules, British values and good citizenship** – Establishing what the rules are and why rules are necessary, keeping safe, making friends etc.

**Autumn** – characteristics of the season, looking at changes in nature – e.g. growth, decay

**Forest School**

**Visiting the park and field** – Autumn observations, playground/physical development/sport

**Counting and numerals** – group counting up to and beyond 10, numeral matching 1-10, numeral recognition 1-10, subitising 1-6 (with dice and dominoes)

**Common 2D shapes**

**Art** – looking at self-portraits of famous artists, recreating Monet's 'Poppy Field' painting

**Mrs Honey's Hat** – listening and comprehension, participation story, days of the week

**Dental Health** – personal care & hygiene, healthy eating, role of dentists

**Remembrance**

**Diwali** – understanding differences in culture and belief, sharing new experiences
